Nicky visits Prague in December 1938 and found families who had fled the rise of the Nazis in Germany and Austria, living in desperate conditions and under threat of Nazi invasion. He immediately realized it was a race against time. How many children could be rescued before the borders closed? Fifty years later Nicky still lives haunted by the fate of the children he wasn't able to bring to safety, blaming himself for not doing more.
